### **Growing in the Word of God**

### II Timothy 2:14-16, 23-24.

Verse 14: Strive about words: Greek: logomacheō = to fight about words.

NAS: to wrangle about words

NET: to wrangle over words

CEB: to engage in battles over words

ESV: to quarrel about words

WT: Do not get involved in unprofitable word battles to the overthrow of those who listen.

Verse 23: strifes: Greek: mach $\bar{e}$  = a fight, battle, conflict, quarrel.

Verse 24: strive: Greek: machomai = to fight, to battle, to struggle, to quarrel.

Verse 5: moderation: Greek:  $epieik\bar{e}s = gentle$ , forbearing, yielding, being actively considerate, waiving just and legal redress, and tempering strict justice with gentle equity, not insisting on just rights.

Verse 6: Be careful: Greek:  $merimna\bar{o} = \text{to}$  be concerned about, but especially to be overly concerned about, to be anxious. It is related to a word meaning "to divide," and it is used to refer to the dividing of the mind or distractions in the mind that cause a person to be anxious or overly concerned.

### Isaiah 26:3:

Thou wilt keep *him* in perfect peace, *whose* mind *is* stayed *on thee*: because he trusteth in thee.

### Colossians 3:1-4.

Keep learning God's Word. Keep growing in God's Word. Do not be distracted by the world's media. Set your thoughts and affections on things above.
