In the new-birth spirit:

Colossians 2:10 (AKJV):

And you are complete in him, which is the head of all principality and power.

complete: Greek: $pl\bar{e}ro\bar{o}$ = to fill. The form here is a perfect passive participle with a substantive verb and thus a periphrastic perfect used in an intensive sense with the emphasis on the existing results: "you are completely filled." The Aramaic form used in the Peshitta text is an eshtaphal form, which has a similar sense, indicating complete fullness. Compare with Ephesians 1:22-23.

Colossians 2:10 (WT):

and you are completely filled in him who is the head over every ruler and authority.

In the physical realm:

Galatians 5:5-6.

Mark 11:22-24.

I Corinthians 14:13 (WT):

Wherefore, let him who speaks in a tongue pray that he may interpret [in the church].

III John 2:

But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

John 13:34-35.

I Corinthians 13:2 (NET):
